Earth Rangers is the Kid's Conservation Organization, dedicated to educating children and their families about biodiversity, inspiring them to adopt sustainable behaviours and empowering them to become directly involved in protecting animals and their habitats.

In 2015, we set the ambitious goal of expanding our programs to every Province and into the Territories—and we did it. We delivered our School Outreach Program to more than 800 schools across the country. We strengthened our conservation partnerships, completing 4 ambitious projects and launching 4 more to help Canadian species at risk. We reached a record numbers of members, over 100,000 children who are more engaged than ever. Thank you for making it all possible.

Conservation from Coast to Coast

Our Bring Back the Wild Projects focus on preserving at-risk species across the country through research and restoration efforts with local partners. In 2015, Earth Rangers successfully completed 4 projects and launched 4 more, each receiving a record amount of funding from Earth Ranger Members.

Proven Impact

In 2015, Earth Rangers collaborated with Ipsos Reid Canada to develop a survey comparing the environmental attitudes, awareness and reported actions of 600 Earth Ranger Members and 600 non-members across the country.

The results amazed us. Earth Ranger Members are more optimistic for the future, more confident in their ability to affect change, and are more altruistic, showing a greater concern not just for the environment but for other social issues.



Earth Ranger Members believe they can make a difference and have a more positive outlook. Earth Ranger Members are much more likely to have adopted environmentally-friendly behaviours.



Participation in Earth Rangers stimulates a greater concern for all social issues, beyond protecting animals and the environment.

A Look Ahead to 2016





Québec Expansion

We have undertaken a major expansion initiative into Québec, including opening a satellite office in Montréal, significantly increasing the quality and scope of our French language programs and increasing our participation in Québec-based conservation projects.

2016 will see the launch of "Project Hub", a re-imagined online experience for our members aimed at significantly lengthening and deepening their engagement. This includes the introduction of 6 Earth Ranger Levels that children can work towards achieving.
